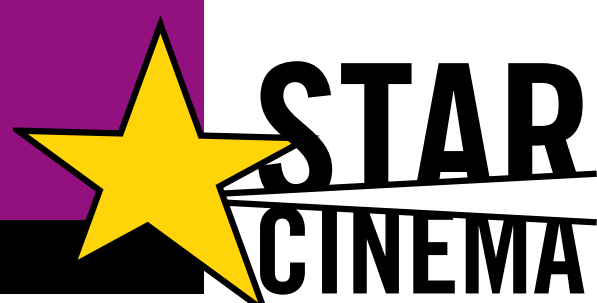

Leonard Cohen: I'm Your Man (G) 105min

Director: Lian Lunson, USA.
Songwriter. Poet. Counter-culture icon. Consummate ladies' man. Since bursting onto the scene in 1967, Leonard Cohen has inspired generations with his unique personality and haunting music, becoming one of the most original and enduring artists to emerge from the 1960s. Now, celebrate Cohen's legacy with Director Lian Lunson's intimate look at the songs, poetry and life of one of music's most celebrated and influential troubadours. Featuring interviews with and performances by U2, Nick Cave, Rufus & Martha Wainwright, Kate & Anna McGarrigle (to name a few!) and Cohen himself. • September 1, 2, 3.



Noise (MA) 108min

Director: Matthew Saville, Australia.
Graham McGahan (Brendan Cowell) is a cop – almost by default, he thinks. Self-centred, beset with doubt and afflicted with tinnitus, a few days before Christmas he is sent by his boss to man a police van in a suburban shopping strip after violent murders rock the local community. McGahan starts to engage with traumatised locals as they deal with the aftermath of these terrible crimes. A strong story with an emotional punch makes this a candidate for the Australian film of 2007. • September 1, 2, 5.



I Do (M) 89min

Director: Eric Lartigau, France.
English subtitles. Subtitled How To Get Married and Stay Single, this is exactly what perfume designer Luis Costa, wants. The only problem is his is the minority voice in the voting committee, which consists of his mother Genevieve and five sisters. To stave off their attempts to marry him off he pays Emma (Charlotte Gainsbourg), the recently returned sister of his best friend Pierre-Yves, to pretend to be his fiancé. This is a funny, heart-warming tale about love, commitment and family. Intelligently written, Directed and performed, this is a charming and enjoyable film. • September 1, 2, 3, 5.



Snowcake (M) 107min

Director: Marc Evans, USA.
Starring Alan Rickman, Emily Hampshire and Sigourney Weaver, this is a quirky character-driven drama set in a beautiful snow-blanketed town in Canada. Alex, an Englishman, arrives in Northern Ontario on his way to meet the woman with whom he's had a son. He's bullied by a 19 year-old hitch-hiker Vivienne into giving her a ride to her hometown, but when the car is hit by a truck Alex finds himself, for the second time in his life, grieving for someone he never knew. Sigourney Weaver's performance as the high-functioning Autistic mother of Vivienne is superb. A film about trust, acceptance, obsessive behaviour, and the power of friendship. • September 7, 8, 9, 10, 12.

Sicko (PG) 118min

Director: Michael Moore, USA.
Following on the heels of his Palme d'Or-winning *Fahrenheit 9/11* and his Oscar-winning film *Bowling For Columbine*, acclaimed filmmaker, Michael Moore's new documentary sets out to investigate the American healthcare system. Sticking to his tried-and-true one-man approach, Moore sheds light on the complicated medical affairs of individuals and local communities. The Flying Scotsman (M) 98min

Director: Douglas Mackinnon, UK: Scotland.
Based on the remarkable true story of Scottish cyclist Graeme Obree. In 1993, and as an unemployed amateur, Obree broke the world one-hour record on a bike of his own revolutionary design, which he constructed out of scrap metal and parts of a washing machine. From a humble background Graeme always had to fight for survival. Graeme had neither the money nor the sponsorship necessary to realise his dream but it was always clear from his complete passion for the sport and his many local wins that he was destined for greatness. • September 6, 7, 8, 9, 11, 16, 18, 19.



Evening (M) 117min

Director: Lajos Koltai, USA.
Uniting a stellar cast – Claire Danes, Toni Collette, Vanessa Redgrave, Patrick Wilson, Hugh Dancy, Natasha Richardson, Mami Gummer, Eileen Atkins, Meryl Streep, Glenn Close – *Evening* is a deeply emotional film that illuminates the timeless love that binds mother and daughter – seen through the prism of one mother's life as it crests with optimism, navigates a turning point, and ebbs to its close. Based on the novel by Susan Minot and adapted for the screen by Ms Minot and Pulitzer Prize-winning author, Michael Cunningham. • September 13, 14, 16, 17, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25.



La Vie En Rose (M) 130min

Director: Olivier Dahan, France.
English subtitles. From the slums of Paris to the limelight of New York, Edith Piaf's life was a battle to sing and survive, live and love. Raised in poverty, Edith's magical voice and her passionate romances and friendships with the greatest names of the period – Yves Montand, Jean Cocteau, Charles Aznavour, Marlene Dietrich, Marcel Cerdan and others – made her a star all around the world. But in her audacious attempt to tame her tragic destiny, the Little Sparrow – her nickname – flew so high she could not fail to burn her wings. I Have Never Forgotten You: The Life & Legacy of Simon Wiesenthal (M) 102min

Director: Richard Trank, USA.
This documentary narrated by Nicole Kidman is a straightforward account of the life and work of Simon Wiesenthal, who was born in a small town in what was then the Austro-Hungarian Empire, and is now Poland, in 1908. He survived the Holocaust, but lost many members of his family during that time, and after the war he set about single-mindedly tracking down Nazi war criminals. An inspiring and positive film about a most compelling subject. • September 21, 22, 23, 24, 26.

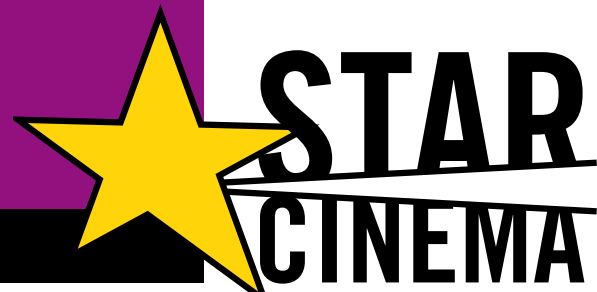

Dr Plonk (G) 83min

Director: Rolf de Heer, Australia.
It is the great year of 1907. Dr Plonk, eminent scientist and inventor, calculates that the world will end in exactly 101 years unless immediate action is taken. Plonk is ridiculed for his beliefs, and so invents a time machine and sets out to collect the necessary proof. Rolf de Heer (Ten Canoes) has spun back cinematic time to the days of Buster Keaton, Harold Lloyd and Charlie Chaplin with an energetic, funny, adventure-filled farce. Lucky Miles (MA) 101min

Director: Michael James Rowland, Australia.
Winner of the Audience Award at the recent Sydney Film Festival, this is a bittersweet comedy about three men and their struggle with the harsh Australian country. It's 1990 and an Indonesia fishing boat drops two groups of refugees on the West Australian coast. The men are told to wait for a bus just over the sand dune hill, however, beyond the sand dune is the barren Australian desert. Pursued by an Army reservist unit the men begin their journeys alone whilst crossing paths in an amusing and absurd fashion. Well worth seeing. • **September 27, 28, 29, October 3.**



After the Wedding (G) 120min

Director: Susanne Bier, Denmark.
English subtitles. Jacob, a Danish citizen who hasn't lived in Denmark for 20 years, works at an orphanage in India. The orphanage is in desperate need of funds, and when a Danish businessman contacts the orphanage about a large donation, Jacob must return to Denmark to sign the contract. Through a series of events, Jacob is drawn into the man's family life and discovers a secret about his past, which makes him question everything he knows about that which he holds dear.
